

# Southern Navigators at Hogmoor Inclosure

## Final Details

### [Directions and Parking](#)

Hogmoor Inclosure is signed on brown road signs off the A325 in Bordon. Entrance is located off Hogmoor Road, What3Words seabirds.charm.next. There is parking on-site for over 100 cars, but this is shared with the general public. We do have access to a small extra on-site parking area that will be exclusively for orienteers, but parking will be tight, so please car share where you can. If we must use the off-site overflow parking, the closest is at The Shed, and at Bordon and Whitehill Leisure centre. This is a 500m walk back to the area and then 500m through the area on the marked route to get to Assembly. There is a map on the last page of Final Details. Please follow the route as marked as it runs through the competition area.

### [Starts](#)

Starts are located 400m from Assembly / car park along a marked route through the area (so please stick to the route). Loose CDs available in the start lanes. Starts open 10:30 – 12:00. Courses close 13:30 so you must be back to download by then. You booked a 15-minute start slot when you entered (shown on racesignup). Please stick to these slots to minimise queues at the start. Some courses are full. They are going to be busy!

### [Finish](#)

Adjacent to the car park but you must follow the marked route to Download in The Beehive immediately after finishing. Please vacate the Finish quickly as it will be busy.

### [SIAC](#)

SIAC will be enabled. Battery test will be available at registration. SIAC check will be available at the Start. Punching Start and Finish.

### [Entry Details](#)

Online entry only via [SN Regional Event and SCOL #4: Hogmoor at Christmas - Information and sign up \(racesignup.co.uk\)](#). Entries close at noon on 29th December but are now subject to map availability. Some courses are full and others are filling fast.

### [Enquiries and First Aid](#)

Located in The Beehive building next to the toilets and café in Hogmoor. What3words visual.taskbar.marzipan. Open 10am – 13:30pm.

### [Map Details](#)

ISOM 2017 on A4 paper. 1:5000 with 5m contours. Brown, Blue, Green and Short Green courses are on double-sided maps. The area is small and please note that some controls are less than 60m apart on different features.

There has been some new play equipment added, some scrub has been cleared, and new hides built since the mapping was done. Since the courses were planned, a shipping container has

been added immediately adjacent to a control site. These new features are therefore not mapped.

The whole area is fenced. The surrounding roads are out-of-bounds, although not marked as such on the map.

### Terrain Description

Hogmoor Inclosure is a mixture of runnable forest and heathland with some areas of intricate contour detail. The area is wetter than usual after recent rains and likely means that the area is wetter than mapped. Dry depressions -> wet, and marshes -> ponds etc.

Please keep to the marked route to the start and to/from off-site overflow car parking (should we have to use it): both sides of marked routes are in the competition area.

### Facilities

Toilets and café. First Aid at Enquiries in The Beehive. Clothes dump at Enquiries.

### Miscellaneous

**Dogs:** Well-behaved dogs are welcome. Please clean up after your dog.

**Safety Bearing:** Head north-west within the fenced area to the children's play area and the buildings.

**Road Crossing:** If we have to use the off-site overflow car parking, you will need to cross the busy A325. Please use the pedestrian crossing.

**Clothing:** Full leg cover is mandatory for this event. In the event of inclement weather, the wearing of gaiters may be compulsory. There is no clothing dump on the area, but clothing can be left at Enquiries at owner's risk.

**Other Users:** The area is popular with dog walkers. Cyclists may also be present.

**Rubbish:** Please take your rubbish home with you or put it in the bins provided around the car park and play area.

**Ticks:** The area suffers from ticks. Please check yourself carefully for ticks once you are home.

**Military Debris:** The area is an ex-military area but has been well-used by the public for several years and there is very little chance of military debris, such as old fencing wire, or unexploded bombs, being found. However, please be vigilant and if you do come across any, please avoid!

**Risk:** Orienteering is an adventure sport. You are primarily responsible for your own safety, including wearing appropriate clothing. Carrying a whistle or phone is recommended. If you have a medical condition we may need to be aware of, please leave a sealed envelope at Enquiries. These will be destroyed post-event if they haven't been collected.
